HISTORY: Our Saviour's Lutheran Church was organized in 1965 as a mission congregation of the Lutheran Church in America. The early congregation worshipped at O'Dea Elementary School until 1967, when the first unit, the current fellowship hall, was completed. In 1977, a much-needed educational wing was added. An organ was purchased in 1978 and served OSLC until its replacement in 2001. Continued growth led to the building of a much larger sanctuary in 1988. An addition to the education wing came in 1991, completing the building as it stands today.

THE NEED

rowth at **Our Saviour's Lutheran Church** over the years has stretched the limits of our facilities. As we welcome more and more families to our congregation, we rejoice that the current building no longer meets the needs of our worship and outreach ministries.

Visitors to Our Saviour's first form an impression of our church when they walk in the door to the **narthex**. What was once substantial space has now become overcrowded, and a space in which a visitor can be lost in a sea of people. We seek a larger and more functional space where there is room for greeting, fellowship and room to welcome those who are new and unfamiliar to our church. An adjoining multipurpose space will provide an additional large area for hosting events for members and community groups alike.

Our kitchen has provided meals for fellowship as well as for those who have nowhere else to turn for sustenance made with loving hands. As we seek to serve more people throughout our community, it is vital that we relocate the **kitchen**, increase its size and update it to a commercial standard. With the ability to serve to the narthex, the multi purpose room and the fellowship hall, our food ministry will have more flexibility and capacity to help us live our mission.

Our Saviour's worship ministry has been blessed with a comprehensive **music program** in which many of our members participate. More musicians who share their musical gifts in a variety of ways means that we need more space for our music room. It also means that the time is past to update the organ and choir area within the sanctuary, provide our pastors with a sacristy to prepare for worship, and upgrade our sound system so everyone benefits from a meaningful worship experience. When visitors cannot hear the music or the pastors, or when they become lost in the service due to a substandard sound system, they are unlikely to ever return.

Basic hospitality to the newcomer to Our Saviour's involves providing restroom facilities which are bright, clean and updated. Whether a first time visitor to worship or a guest to Faith and Family Hospitality, our restrooms indicate the levels to which we are willing to go to serve our neighbors. This calls for a full remodel of our north and south restrooms.

A ministry with the vibrancy of Our Saviour's requires many people to work "behind the scenes." We must no longer expect our staff and volunteers to work in overcrowded and insufficient **office areas.** Relocating, expanding and remodeling our administrative offices will ensure that those who work on our behalf have the space necessary to do so.


Safety and comfort are paramount in any location where people gather, but nowhere more than a church and preschool. Our **playground** is worn, and some would say unsafe for children. By relocating our playground to where it will be in full view of passersby on Lemay, we make a bold statement that Our Saviour's welcomes and values families with children, and in the process we can install the very latest in equipment which is far safer-and more fun!

This is also an opportunity to update the **parking lot** flow, improving safety for those who visit and attend Our Saviour's. Finally, an updated **fire system** is a must as we remodel our building. Updating our **air conditioning** will likewise keep those who struggle in the heat comfortable in the haven that is our church.

We rejoice that we live and serve in the exciting city of Fort Collins, a city that prides itself on providing for its growing population while maintaining the natural aesthetic that we all love. When carrying out changes to Our Saviour's therefore, we must abide by ordinances and regulations which add significantly to the cost of our projects as determined by **city code**. Most of these are unavoidable, regardless of the scope of renovations.

CHALLENGE GOAL - \$2,550,515

Congregational and campaign leadership has established our base goal at \$1,500,000.

The costs of these renovations and improvements total \$2,550, 515. Our congregation has overwhelmingly shared its desire to address all of these needs in one campaign, asking each family to share the gifts that God has provided generously and with a heart for service to others. Therefore, our *challenge goal* is \$2,550, 515.

In addition, our faith calls us as a congregation to share our blessings with others. Therefore, we will tithe all gifts given to the campaign to Habitat for Humanity. Our abundance will mean a safe, inspiring home for hard working families who provide their own "sweat equity"

for their home and others' homes as they pay it forward.

Our stewardship extends to the budgeted costs of this campaign (\$40,000). Fully funding our plan would mean that our fundraising costs for this effort will be less than 2%.

Different families have different capacities to participate financially. In order to meet this challenging goal, however, we know that we must receive three-year commitments at the following levels to fully subscribe this campaign:

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Does the campaign replace our annual stewardship?

A. No, we are asking you to prayerfully consider a commitment to the campaign in addition to your annual stewardship gifts. Only by raising the funds for this campaign and by increasing our annual stewardship effort can we as a congregation begin to realize all that God has in store for us and for Our Saviour's!

Q. Why is this campaign being launched now?

A. If we don't act now, we risk being complacent and not living into what God is calling us to become as a family of faith. There is plenty of ministry that needs to happen both within the walls of Our Saviour's and beyond. We also risk higher costs of construction and potential financing as each year passes. Construction inflation alone is estimated to be 10% annually in our region!

Q. How long does the campaign last and when do we begin making our contributions?

A. Contributions toward this campaign will continue for up to three years. Contributions may begin December 1, 2016.

Q. Will I be visited?

A. Yes. You will receive a personalized proposal and a commitment forms on which you will indicate your financial commitment for the campaign and stewardship effort. You will also receive an envelope in which to seal your response. A fellow member of Our Saviour's will then arrange to meet you at your home, the church, or another convenient location to receive your sealed commitment. Please view the visit as a time for faithful disciples to share the joy of being a part of Christ's church and in fellowship with one another.

Q. Will I be told how much to give?

A. Absolutely not! Information about the gifts necessary to meet our important campaign's challenge goal of \$2,550,515 will be provided to all members. You and your family will be asked to prayerfully consider and fill out two commitment cards; one for a three-year financial commitment to the Generations Building and Serving Community in God's Love campaign as well as another for your annual commitment to next year's stewardship effort. In preparation for these decisions, we ask that your family open your hearts and minds to what God is calling you to do through prayer, Bible study, and worship.

Q. We will be billed for the amount of our response?

A. No, you will be sent a confirmation of your commitment. From that point forward a quarterly statement will be sent for your records.

Q. Will gift amounts be published?

A. No, only the amounts for the entire congregational response will be celebrated.

Q. Why am I receiving two commitment cards?

A. In order to avoid the confusion of two campaigns (Generations Building and Serving Community in God's Love and our annual stewardship drive), we have combined them. In doing so, you may prayerfully consider your commitment to both the operations of Our Saviour's, focused on supporting our 2017 operating budget, and the Generations Building and Serving Community in God's Love three-year commitment, focused on renewing our building for enhanced ministry and benevolence. We ask that you complete both forms at the same time.

Q. How do I make a gift of appreciated stock?

A. Have your broker transfer shares from your account to the congregation's account. A form with the necessary information will be provided to you. IMPORTANT! Do not sell the stock yourself or you will be liable for the capital gains tax. The church's broker will sell the stock, and you will get credit for its average market value on the day it is transferred. Only in the case of capital loss should you sell the asset yourself.

Q. What if I cannot make a large gift?

A. Every gift is important. We learn in Matthew that where our treasure is, our heart will be also. This campaign is about much more than the money that will be raised. It is about us, as a family of faith, working together. As we each give as we are able, our hearts and our trust will be in the Lord and our ministry will make a great difference in our community and our world.



There are many ways in which the ministry of Our Saviour's is important to me, and it is not easy to come up with a short, concise answer. As I reflect on all they ways that our ministries have impacted my own life, there are two words that stick out: FAMILY, and ACCEPTANCE. I have been involved in small group, Sunday School and youth ministries, music ministry along with the many other opportunities of service that OSLC offers.
