Blessings to you this Christmas!

We can relate to the InnKeeper in the Christmas story as sometimes we find ourselves entering the story as ones that have no more room for Jesus. It's not that we don't want to have room, we just find we're too full. As our culture demands more of your time, more of your money, more of your focus it is easy to ignore the Grace of



the Christ Child. We have valid excuses like the innkeeper. As we consider our lives in Christ perhaps we can remind ourselves of who we are, and whose we are. ### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

We have about \$400,000 in committed dollars still outstanding, but pledged for our Capital Campaign as we enter the third year of the campaign. We have taken out a loan of \$1,200,000 through the Mission Investment Fund, and have about \$100,000 left in estimated expenses. This means that after our pledges have come in at the end of 2019 we should have a loan of \$900,000 or less.

We are grateful for the additional gifts that have come in to get us to this point. Those gifts that were either pledged above commitments or are coming from members who did not pledge but gave a gift have totaled over \$125,000. We are grateful for all of you who have made gifts over and above your original commitments. Continued gifts will be used to pay down the debt and reduce our monthly payments.

We remind you that you can call the office to check on how you are doing in completing your pledges.

- \*Individual gifts to organizations supported by the church can be donated through the church.
- \*If you want to donate stock talk to your broker. A donation of stock can let you avoid the capital gains on your gift while giving you the full tax-credit for your donation.
- \*If you would like to fill out a commitment card for next year they are still available in the narthex.

### **NEWS FROM HABITAT**

**OSLC/FOCOLU Sponsored Habitat Homes will be Dedicated on Sunday, December 16**. Aaron and Andi Taylor's home will be dedicated at **1 pm** and at **2 pm** (across the street) Munawar and Rebecca Masih's home will be dedicated. OSLC has been important in financially supporting these two home builds, and volunteer crews from our church have helped physically to build both homes. Parking is available either at Harmony Cottages (SE corner of Harmony and Taft Hill Roads) or at the ReStore (4001 S Taft Hill Rd). If you would like to bring a non-perishable food item, we will use it to stock the food pantries of each home. Please join us in these home celebrations.

Next year from November 8-16, 2019, please consider helping a poor family in Jordan obtain a decent and secure place to live. We are now organizing a team of volunteers from OSLC and the other FOCOLU churches to participate in this adventure. Jordan, located next to Israel, is an ancient country considered to be an important part of the cradle of Western civilization. In addition to helping a family in need, this trip will provide opportunities to learn first-hand more about Islam and what daily life is like for people living in a Muslim country. Cultural opportunities are planned to help us to better understand Middle Eastern life. In terms of food, the Jordanian cuisine is considered one of the best in the region. **The timing of this trip is designed to come just before the FOCOLU Holy Land Tour that is currently being planned, so that those building a home in Jordan can join the Holy Land Tour and extend their educational and cultural opportunities.** An informational meeting on the Jordan Build will be held on Monday, January 14. ### A WORD FROM LUMIN (LUTHERAN CAMPUS MINISTRY)

"That's what's so powerful about the ministry here at LuMin. We realize that the Holy Spirit is poured out upon all people, and that we are moved through the world to spread God's love." This was said by Keith Evenson who graduated from Colorado State University as an Electrical Engineer this past spring. Just six days before receiving his diploma he was the student preacher on the Day of Pentecost at our Sunday night worship.

He said that one of the major gifts of the ministry was the people who made up the assembly at worship and Sunday supper. He identified some of those who sat next to him over his four years. "Gay and straight, those who don't speak English, senior citizens and college age students, those with disabilities, NRA members, adults with a salary and family along side of homeless people, Lutherans, Catholics, Buddhists, Agnostics, one time visitors and the closest of friends... people I've cried with at funerals, and then laughed with in the car the next week as I was trying to learn the riffs to Uptown Funk." Keith went on to say, "The people I just listed, they're not people you could find at every church. But they should be." He goes on to say, "The whole point of Pentecost is that is takes all kinds of people to make the church work."

At Lutheran Campus Ministry in Fort Collins we post everywhere, "ALL ARE WELCOME!" We do not mean all Lutheran students, but ALL PEOPLE. That is a key ingredient in sending our students into the world as apostles. At LuMin we are clear that we are about the business of equipping apostles. We are a resurrection people that proclaim the mission and message of Jesus. Campus ministry students experience God's love so that they can speak and be God's love in the world...to all people.

We are working to conclude a \$50,000 fundraising effort to update bathrooms, kitchen, and living spaces while adding showers and laundry. This will both put us in a position to care for the students who come to the ministry, but also as a future goal of providing support for homeless college students using our building several days a week as a drop-in center. We know that there are students who can attend this land-grant institution, but they can not afford the high cost of rent in Fort Collins. Students are "couch-surfing" or trying to live out of cars. We have a plan to support these students using the asset of our building. (More information can be found on our website). We are a ministry of APOSTLES striving to care for ALL.

The concluding words of Keith's sermon addressed the community. "You all challenged me to be a better apostle every day. Find out how you wanna spread God's love. You're an apostle! Go into the world, and share God's love with it. Meet someone where they're at and appreciate your time in this amazing community of apostles. Amen."
