

KISS MINISTRY

Lorna Reeves and I did a music program in Greeley the other day. In the front row sat a sweet man in a wheel-chair by the name of Bill. Bill was having a birthday. He had turned 94 years old. We sang happy birthday to him and I went over to hold his hands.

He whispered to me, "I need to talk to you before you go."

I was in a hurry to get back to Fort Collins because of weather conditions; however, something told me talking with Bill was more important.

After the program, I sat down next to Bill. He held my hands and looked me in the eyes. There were 94 years of wisdom and life in those eyes.

He began, "I lost my wife last month. It was January 8." I told him how sorry I was for his loss.

He continued, "Before we went to sleep at night, my wife and I always sang a song to each other.

He started to sing, "I love you a bushel and a peck, a bushel and a peck and a hug around the neck."



It was the first song for the February music program because of Valentine's Day.

Love was the theme for this month.

Then he said, "I have an uncle who has an oak tree growing by his grave. My family always makes sure there is a yellow ribbon around the trunk of that oak tree." Well, guess what song we also sang that day? You guessed it! "Tie a yellow ribbon round the old oak tree, it's been three long years, do you still want me?" by Tony Orlando and Dawn.

Bill and I decided that there are no coincidences in this life. There was a reason him and I were brought together through music on this particular day. We decided that someone was trying to get a message to him, that his wife was closer than what he knew, and that everything was going to be OK. It's like God used me as a messenger for Bill. I still shiver just thinking about it.

In the end, Bill wanted one of my music packets to keep. A music packet usually contains 30 songs typed in 18 font for easier reading/singing. I gave him the best packet I had after using the packets for fifteen programs. I told him I looked forward to seeing him next month. He said he would be there one way or another. The tough part about doing a program once a month at any given facility is that sometimes the person is not there that next month because of hospitalization, another level of care needed, or simply passing away to that next dimension. I guess this is reminder to all of us that tomorrow is not guaranteed for any of us and to live in the moment, one day at a time and not worry so much about "stuff."

There are other stories I could share, too. I just wanted to remind all of us that what we do for seniors, and people in general, is very important. Each one of the KISS volunteers is treasured on a daily basis and thank you, the OSLC congregation, for all you do to support the KISS music program through donations of time, money, sheet music, and instruments. It is appreciated more than you know. It's called the "ripple effect."




HAND WARMER UPDATE
