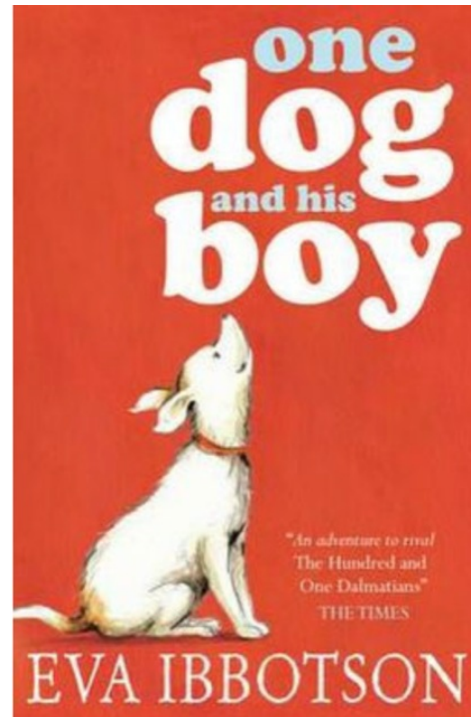

MICHELLE ROBY - YAGM

Michelle Roby has been a member of OSLC her whole life! Now, she is embarking on a mission through the ELCA called Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM). Michelle will be serving in Mexico as a YAGM volunteer starting in August. She will be one of more than 70 young adults serving on behalf of the ELCA in 9 different country programs around the world! Michelle will be working with an organization in southern Mexico that works on environmental sanitation and water systems and technology.

The total cost for one young adult in the program is \$15,000. Each person is tasked with raising a minimum of \$5,000 to help support their year of service. The ELCA commits to raising the additional \$10,000 per volunteer through

generous congregations and donors. If more than \$5,000 in gifts is received, the additional funds will be help to support other young adult volunteers and ensure that there is a sustainable source of revenue for future the Young Adults in Global Mission program.

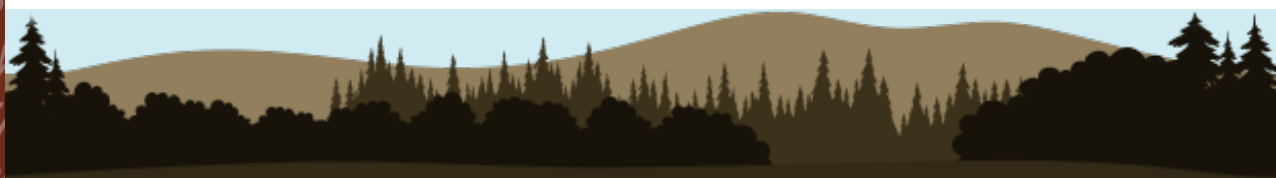
