 What is Equitable?

The parable from Matthew 20 is perplexing as it can be "heard" and understood from many vantage points in our society. We have a culture that ties work ethic to financial security and stability, yet this is often not actually the case for many in our country or world. Many people in many countries work 12, 15 or more hours a day just to have a little to eat and maybe shelter. Even in the United States, minimum wage workers need to work 50-60 hours a week just to meet basic needs for their families. When we look at our neighbor either next door or across the world do we see them as competition for resources or are we making sure that they have enough?

This week as a household, intentionally think about letting other people be "first." Perhaps it's in line at a store, serving someone their meal first, picking up trash from a neighbor's yard, making cookies and giving them away to a friend or neighbor, or saving all the household's change from the week and giving it to World Hunger or Bread for the World (or any charity).
